NOTICE TO PLAYERS

Play is governed by the 2019 Rules of Golf as approved by the United States Golf Association and R&A, its clarifications and interpretations, 2020 Texas Golf Association Local Rules and Terms of the Competition ('Hard Card') and where applicable, the following Local Rules. All Local Rules listed on Lighthouse Country Club scorecards, notice boards or posted on the course are **not** in effect for this qualifying round. Unless otherwise noted below, penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty.

- 1. <u>Format:</u> The qualifying round is scheduled for 18 holes of individual stroke play. Players are competing for **7 qualifying spots** and **4 alternate positions**.
- 2. Tees: Play will be contested from the Gold tee markers.
- 3. <u>Automotive Transportation:</u> Players may walk or ride in sectional qualifying at their discretion. Carts are limited to two (2) riders at a time and two (2) carts per group. While there is more than one player in a cart, facemasks MUST be worn. Players can place their clubs on the cart and walk without having to wear a facemask. Violations or intentional disregard will be considered a breach of the TGA Code of Conduct. For more information, see the updated <u>TGA Covid-19 Championship</u> Guidelines.
- 4. <u>Playoffs:</u> Ties for the last qualifying spot and alternate positions will be broken by a sudden death hole-by-hole playoff. There will be no playoff for medalist. The playoff will begin at approximately 4:00 pm. All announcements pertaining to the playoff will be made at the scoring area.
- 5. <u>Scoring:</u> Scores must be attested and verified verbally immediately after completing the qualifying round to the designated TGA scoring area, which is located adjacent to the clubhouse. The scorecard is considered returned when the player verbally approved what is online/on the tv screen.
- **6.** Out of Bounds: Out of bounds is defined by white stakes and roadways.
 - Note: If a ball crosses a roadway and comes to rest on another hole, that ball is out of bounds even though it is on the golf course.
- 7. <u>Flagsticks:</u> Flagsticks may not be touched or removed. Violations or intentional disregard will be considered a breach of the TGA Code of Conduct. For more information, see the TGA Covid-19 Championship Guidelines.
- 8. <u>Holed:</u> A ball must be holed for the score to count. Should a ball hit the foam insert and come to rest outside the hole, the ball is not considered holed.
- 9. <u>Cart Paths:</u> Cart paths that consist of crushed granite, gravel, cement and the like are obstructions. Areas consisting of similar material that are directly adjacent to the cart part are considered part of the same obstruction. Relief is available under Rule 16.
- 10. <u>Red Penalty Areas:</u> Red penalty areas are defined by a red line. When a red line is not present, the edge of the red penalty area is defined by the course side points at ground level of red stakes. For the red penalty area on Hole 9, the edge of the of the penalty area is defined by the grass that is taller than rough height, *stakes identify only*.
- **11.** <u>Bunkers:</u> When a player's ball lies in a bunker, the player may take free relief once by placing the original ball or another ball in and playing it from this relief area:
 - Reference Point: Spot of the original ball.
 - Size of Relief Area Measured from Reference Point: One club-length, the reference point, but with these limits:
 - Limits on Location of Relief Area:
 - o Must not be nearer the hole than the reference point, and
 - o Must be in the bunker.

In proceeding under this Local Rule, the player must choose a spot to place the ball and use the procedures for replacing a ball under Rules 14.2b(2) and 14.2e.

- 12. <u>Doubt as to Procedure:</u> If a competitor is in doubt as to a procedure under the rules and a referee is not proximately available, to avoid delay he may play a second ball under Rule 20.1c(3). He **must** report the facts to the Committee before returning his scorecard, otherwise he is **disqualified**. **Should you need assistance please contact Ian at (636) 328-3242.**
- 13. <u>Evacuation Procedure:</u> Players are to evacuate the golf course to the clubhouse for instructions.
- 14. Pace of Play: The established Pace of Play for Lighthouse Country Club is 4:17 for 18 holes.
