NOTICE TO PLAYERS

Play is governed by the 2019 Rules of Golf as approved by the United States Golf Association and R&A, its clarifications, 2020 Legends Junior Tour Local Rules and Terms of the Competition ('Hard Card') and where applicable, the following Local Rules. All Local Rules listed on Lakeway Country Club scorecards, notice boards or posted on the course are **NOT** in effect for this event. Unless otherwise noted, penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty.

- 1. Format: The competition is scheduled for 36 holes of stroke-play competition.
- 2. <u>Caddies:</u> Rule 10.3a is modified in this way: A player must not have a caddie during the round.
- 3. Tees: The Boys 15-18 division will play from the BLUE LIT tee markers. The Boys 14 & Under division will play from the WHITE LIT tee markers. The Girls 12-18 division will play from the RED LIT tee markers.
- 4. <u>Automotive Transportation:</u> Players must walk at all times during play of any hole and must not use or accept automotive transportation unless acting under the direction of an LJT Referee. Push/Pull carts are permitted. Players may accept rides in a golf cart in between play of any two holes.
- 5. Scoring: Scorecards must be attested and returned immediately after completing your round to the designated LIT scoring area next to the clubhouse.
- 6. <u>Procedure for ties:</u> In the event of a tie for the overall champion, a sudden death hole-by-hole playoff will be conducted, until a winner is declared. The playoff will occur immediately after all scores have been verified. All other ties for awards and LIT Player of the Year points will be split.

SUPPLEMENTAL RULES OF PLAY

- 1. Out of Bounds: In addition to the line between the course-side points, at ground level of white stakes and fence posts, out of bounds is also defined by:
 - a) The course side edge of paved roadways;
 - b) The course side edge of all stone walls, stone pillars, and perimeter stone; **Note**: A ball which crosses a road defined as out of bounds and comes to rest beyond that road is deemed to be out of bounds, even though it may lie on another part of the course.
- 2. <u>Drop Zone for Hole 3 Penalty Area:</u> As an additional option under Rule 17.1, under a penalty of one stroke, a player may drop a ball in the drop zone provided. **Drop Zone Location:** Forward tee of hole 3, 110 yards from green
- 3. <u>Decorative Stones Adjacent to Cart Paths:</u> The decorative stones and artificial surfaces that are close to the cart paths are deemed to all be part of the same obstruction, from which relief without penalty will be granted under Rule 16.1.
- 4. <u>Immovable Obstructions:</u> All roads and paths on the course, even if not artificially surfaced, are treated as immovable obstructions from which free relief is allowed under rule 16.1.
- 5. <u>Ground Under Repair:</u> Ground under repair is defined by white lines. Areas of ground under repair that have been tied into an obstruction by a white line join the ground under repair and the obstruction together as a single abnormal course condition. On holes 10 and 17, the edge of the abnormal course condition coincides with the boundary edge. The following areas of Ground Under Repair have a drop zone as an additional option for relief under rule 16.1
 - a. Hole 10 behind the putting green;
 - b. Hole 17 behind the putting green.

In addition, ground under repair may include unmarked areas of unusual damage caused by heavy equipment traffic that have materially affected the ground surface, but only when declared by the Rules Committee.

- 6. <u>Model Local Rules:</u> Model Local Rule D-7 (Limiting when stroke made from putting green must be replayed) is in effect for the Jimmy Demaret JC.
- 7. <u>Temporary Immovable Obstructions:</u> Model Local Rule F-23 is in effect. Temporary Immovable Obstructions (TIOs) include but are not limited to: machinery; trucks; stacked pipe; championship signs; starting and scoring tents; and temporary restrooms. If a player is allowed relief under the TIO Local Rule from physical or line of sight interference or it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found had come to rest in such a TIO, the player may take relief without penalty, on either side (see Clause e Local Rule).

<u>Special Relief Procedure – Hole 16:</u> The TIO behind and to the left of the putting green of hole 16 is defined by a white line. The white line defines the edge of the TIO and joins the individual obstructions together as a single TIO. The line itself is part of the TIO. A ball touching such a line is in the TIO. As an additional option the player may drop the original ball or another ball, without penalty, in the Dropping Zone that is located adjacent to the TIO.

- 8. <u>Doubt as to procedure:</u> If a competitor is in doubt as to a procedure under the rules and a referee is not proximately available, to avoid delay he may play a second ball under Rule 20.1c (3). The player **must** report the facts to the Committee before returning his scorecard, otherwise he is subject to **disqualification**.
- 9. Pace of Play: The established Pace of Play for The Hills Country Club's Live Oak Course is 4:31 for 18 holes. The time to complete each hole is printed on the scorecard and the LJT Pace of Play Guidelines are listed on the reverse side of the scorecard.
