QUALIFYING INFORMATION FOR PLAYERS

FACE MASKS/COVERINGS: All players, caddies and spectators are required to provide their own mask and have them available when needed. All players, caddies and spectators are required to fully comply with all club policies at all times. Masks are strongly encouraged any time safe distancing cannot be practiced. See <u>TGA Championship COVID-19 Guidelines</u> for complete details.

FORMAT/QUALIFYING PLACES: 18 Holes of individual stroke play qualifying. Allocation of places will be established after the close of entries. Successful qualifiers will be advancing to Sectional qualifying for the U.S. Open Championship. 121st U.S. Open Championship to be played June 17-20, 2021 at Torrey Pines GC in San Diego, Calif.

CHECK-IN: Upon arrival, please proceed to the registration tent to complete COVID Assessment and receive qualifying information. Registration will be located in the breezeway next to the golf shop.

STARTING TIMES: Starting times and pairings will be released on Wednesday, April 28th. Starting times, pairings and complete results can be found by visiting the Texas Golf Association website at www.txga.org.

PRACTICE FACILITIES: Practice facilities will open an hour before play begins. A shuttle will be available to transport players to the driving range.

CADDIES: Caddies are permitted and must be provided by the player.

TRANSPORTATION: Players and their caddies must walk at all times during the qualifying round, unless authorized by a Rules Committee member. A push/pull cart may be used to transport clubs.

SPECTATOR CARTS: Spectator carts are not permitted. Spectators must walk at all times.

PRACTICE ROUND AVAILABILITY: Players may contact the golf shop directly after the close of entries (April 21, 2021 – 5:00 pm EDT) at (830) 598-5301 to schedule a practice round. Based on club availability, practice rounds may be scheduled Wednesday, April 28th between 2:00 – 4:00 pm, Thursday, April 29th between 2:00 – 4:00 pm or Sunday, May 2nd between 2:00 – 4:00 pm. **Practice round green fee is \$20.00+tax. Additional \$28.00+tax cart fee for players wishing to ride.**

PLAYOFF: In the event of a tie for the last qualifying places, ties for qualifying spots and alternate positions will be decided by a sudden death, hole-by-hole, playoff immediately after all scores have been verified. It is the players responsibility to be present if a playoff is needed.

FOOTWEAR: Shoes with traditionally designed spikes (regardless of composition, i.e., ceramic, plastic, etc.) or spikes, regardless of design, comprised either entirely or partially of metal (if such metal may come in contact with the course) are prohibited during the stipulated round. Penalty for breach of this condition: **DISQUALIFICATION**.

GROOVES: The players clubs <u>must conform</u> to the grooves and punch mark specifications in The Rules of Golf that are effective from January 1, 2010. *See Model Local Rule G2 for details.*

DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES: Under Rule 4.3a, Distance Measuring Devices (DMD) are permitted at all USGA qualifying events, including Opens. DMDs may be used to measure distance only, all other functions must be turned off. If during the round a player or their caddie uses the device to gauge or measure other conditions that might effect their play (e.g. elevation changes, wind speed, etc.) the

player is in breach of **Rule 4.3**, for which the penalty is Two Strokes and for any subsequent offense of Rule 4.3 – **DISQUALIFICATION.** See page 10 of Player Packet for details.

ONE BALL CONDITION: As a reminder to all players the "One Ball Condition" is in effect for Qualifying. See Model Local Rule G4 for details.

EVACUATION PLAN: In the event of a discontinuance of play during the qualifier, players must adhere to the evacuation plan distributed in the Player Packet. See pages 8 & 9 of Player Packet for details.

QUALIFYING ROUND FEES: Fees are included in the USGA championship entry fee.

GOLF SHOP/LOCKER ROOM/PRACTICE AREAS: Players will have limited access to locker room and clubhouse facilities. Players are required to fully comply with all club policies.

PERSONAL APPEARANCE: In Local and Sectional Qualifying stages and the Championships proper, players must be neat in appearance with respect to clothing and personal grooming. The Committee in charge decides whether this requirement has been met and has the authority to withdraw the entry of a player who does not comply. The wearing of shorts is permitted in this qualifier.

FOOD SERVICE: Limited food and beverage services will be available for purchase at the smoke shack near the 10th tee. For \$20.00 (per person) players and caddies will can purchase lunch and full access to on-course comfort station. Comfort stations include quick snacks and beverage options. The club will accept both cash and credit for these purchases. Credit card only for all other purchases.

LOCAL ACCOMMODATIONS: There are a number of hotels available nearby in the Horseshoe Bay area.

USGA Pace of Play Policy

Under Rule 5.6 all players must play without unreasonable delay and at a prompt pace. Outlines below is the USGA Pace of Play Policy that the Committee has established.

Maximum Allowable Time

Maximum allowable time is the maximum time is the maximum time deemed necessary by the Committee for a group to complete its round. This is expressed in a per-hole and aggregate time format on the attached chart.

- A group's **maximum allowable time** begins at its assigned starting time, or if the starting times is delayed, at the adjusted starting time.
- The associated with playing the round, example: course difficulty and walking times between holes, is included in all **maximum allowable times**.

Definition of "Out of Position"

A group is out of position when it:

- Completes play of a hole (replaces the flagstick) later than the **maximum allowable time** given (see attached chart) **and**:
 - a) Reaches a par-3 hole that is clear of all play and all players in the preceding group have played their strokes from the teeing area of the next hole.
 - b) Reaches a par-4 or par-5 which is not clear of all play, but which becomes clear of all play <u>before</u> all players in the group have played their strokes from the teeing area.
 - c) Reaches a par-4 or par-5 hole which is clear of all play.

Note: If a ruling or some other legitimate delay occurs which causes the group in question to be **out of position**, that group is expected to regain its position within a reasonable time.

Timing

When the Committee determines that a group (or individual) will be timed, all players (or a specific individual) in the group will be notified by a Rules Official.

Other than on the putting green, the timing of a player's stroke will begin when it is the player's turn to play, and the player can play without interference or distraction. Time spent determining yardage and other conditions (such as wind) will count as time taken for the next stroke.

On the putting green, the time of a player's stroke will begin after the player has allowed a reasonable amount of time to mark, lift, clean and replace the ball, repair ball marks, and remove loose impediments on the line of play. Time spent looking at the line from beyond the hole or to the side of and/or behind the ball will count as part of the time taken for the next stroke.

A player is permitted a maximum of <u>40 seconds</u> to play a stroke, and an extra 10 seconds (for a total of 50 seconds) will be permitted for the first player to play:

- a) A stroke on a par-3 hole;
- b) A second stroke on a par-4 or par-5 hole;
- c) A third stroke on a par-5 hole;
- d) Around the putting green; and
- e) On the putting green.

Any player in a group being timed who exceeds the **maximum allowable time** to play a stroke will be informed as soon as practicable by a Referee.

A Referee will not advise a group that it has regained its proper position on the course and is no longer being timed.

Note: The Committee reserves the right, at any time, to time a group when deemed necessary. Further, if the Committee determines a player to be unreasonably slow, the player may be timed individually at the Committee's discretion regardless of whether the group is **out of position**. Players should also be aware that the Committee may assess a "bad time" to a player in a group which is **out of position** if the player makes no effort to help the group get back in position. An example of this would be a player who delays play between shoots or holes.

Pace of Play Penalties

The following are the penalties, in sequence, for any player in a group being timed who takes more than the maximum allowable time to play a stroke after timing of the player's stroke begins:

1st bad timing exceeding the allowable time - Warning

2nd bad timing - 1 stroke penalty

3rd bad timing - General penalty (2 stroke penalty)

4th bad timing - Disqualification

Note: If a group being timed regains its proper position, any previous "bad time(s)" will be carried over for the remainder of that round in the event that group requires additional monitoring. Any player who has a "bad time(s)" will be reminded of the "bad time(s)" if the player or group required additional timing during the round.

EVACUATION PLAN: STOPPING AND RESUMING PLAY

Stopping and Resuming Play

An immediate suspension will be signaled by one prolonged airhorn note. All other types of suspension will be signaled by three consecutive airhorn notes. Resumption of play will be signaled by two short airhorn notes.

- Immediate Suspension (Imminent Danger): One prolonged airhorn note. All players must stop play at once and must not make another stroke until the Committee Resumes Play. See Rule 5.7b(1).
- **Normal Suspension (Darkness or Unplayable Course Conditions):** Three consecutive airhorn notes. If all players in the group are between two holes, they must stop play and must not make a stroke to begin another hole until the Committee resumes play. If any player in the group has started a hole, the players may choose either stop play or to play out the hole. See Rule 5.7b(2).
- **Resuming Play:** Two short airhorn notes. See Rule 5.7c. Players must continue play with the same clubs selected for the qualifying round. Place a ball on the spot from which it was lifted.

Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule J-1.

Penalty for Breach of Rule 5.7b and Rule 5.7c - Disqualification

Practice Areas

- Immediate Suspension (Dangerous Situation): All practice facilities are closed during an immediate suspension for a dangerous situation until the Committee has declared them open. Players who practice on closed practice areas will be asked to stop practicing; failure to stop practicing may result in disqualification.
- Normal Suspension: Players may practice as the Committee provides.

Evacuation Procedure

- Immediate Suspension (Dangerous Situation): Players must immediately evacuate to the listed locations.
- Normal Suspensions: Unless otherwise instructed by the Committee, players are to proceed to the listed locations.

- Other on Course Shelters and Restrooms: 6 tee; halfway house; 15 tee
- Clubhouse Evacuation Rooms: locker room or other areas designated by the Committee.



UNDERSTANDING THE RULES OF DMDs

Beginning on January 1, 2019, distance-measuring devices (DMDs) are allowed under the Rules of Golf. Take a look below to see what types of functions on your DMD are allowed under the Rules.

WHAT'S THE RULE?

Rule 4.3a allows the use of distance-measuring devices so long as the player does not access any information that is prohibited under this Rule (details below). The first breach of this Rule means the player gets a loss of hole penalty in match play or a two-stroke penalty in stroke play. A second breach of Rule 4.3 during the same round results in disqualification. NOTE: A golf course or the Committee in charge of a competition does have the option to prohibit the use of distance-measuring devices by Local Rule.

TYPES OF DEVICES



PLAYER ACTIONS

A player may use a device that is capable of operating a prohibited function, provided these specific functions are not accessed by the player during the round. "Access" is interpreted to mean that the player has viewed or otherwise used the information generated by a prohibited function, or the player uses a device where such output is displayed.

WHAT CAN I ACCESS?



Distance between two points (actual)



Pre-published information (e.g., swing tips or advice on playing the hole)



Scorecard



Local weather information or alert for nearby lightning



Chart showing average club distances, obtained from prior rounds, for a wide range of clubs

WHAT CAN'T I ACCESS?



Displays of effective playing distances (e.g., slopebased and other plays-like distance information)



Club recommendation



Processed or analyzed club distances from current round



Gauged or measured variable environmental conditions, such as wind speed or altitude



Analysis or display of swing, set-up or other swing mechanics





USE ADDITIONAL CARE

If a device is readily viewable by the player (e.g., the player is wearing a multi-functional watch) and information is being displayed that, if accessed, would result in a breach of the Rules, the player is considered to have "used" the information generated by a prohibited function, even if the player has not actually viewed it.



Local Rules and Terms of the Competition

FOR 2021 USGA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Rules of Golf as approved by the United States Golf Association and R&A Rules Limited govern play. These Local Rules and Terms of the Competition are in effect at all USGA championships and qualifying rounds. See applicable championship or qualifying round Notice to Players and Entry Application for modifications or additions to these Local Rules and Terms of the Competition. Complete text of the Rules and Local Rules may be found in the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf, effective January 2019.

Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty.

Out of Bounds — Defined by the line between the course-side points of white stakes and fence posts at groundlevel.

Penalty Areas — When a penalty area is defined on only one side, it extends to infinity. When a penalty area is connected to the out-of-bounds edge, the penalty area extends to and coincides with out of bounds.

Ground Under Repair — Defined by white lines. French drains are ground under repair. For grass-covered trenching, see Temporary Power Lines and Cables.

Ground under repair may include areas of unusual damage, including areas where spectators or other traffic has combined with wet conditions to affect materially the ground surface, but only when so declared by an authorized member of the Committee. When immediately adjacent to an immovable obstruction, such an area is part of that obstruction.

Relief from Seams of Cut Turf — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule F-7.

Immovable Obstructions — Include plastic bumpers on roads and paths, and mats secured to the ground with spikes when the bumpers or mats cover cables.

White-Lined Areas Tying Into Artificially Surfaced Roads and Paths — White-lined areas of ground under repair and the artificially surfaced roads, paths or other identified obstructions that they are connected to are a single abnormal course condition when taking relief under Rule 16.1.

Wood Chips and Mulch — Are loose impediments.

Integral Objects — Include cables, rods, wires and wrappings when closely attached to trees, and artificial walls and pilings when located in penalty areas or in or adjacent to bunkers, and bunker liners.

An exposed bunker liner may be treated as ground under repair, but interference does not exist if the liner interferes only with the player's stance.

Temporary Power Lines and Cables — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule F-22.

Temporary Immovable Obstructions — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule F-23.

List of Conforming Driver Heads — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule G-1.

Groove and Punch Mark Specifications — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect, except as modified by the applicable championship Entry Application. Model Local Rule G-2.

List of Conforming Golf Balls — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule G-3.

One Ball Rule — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule G-4.

Broken or Significantly Damaged Club — Local Rule as prescribed in the Clarifications to the 2019 Rules of Golf is in effect. Model Local Rule G-9.

Back-On-the-Line Relief — Local Rule as prescribed in the Clarifications to the 2019 Rules of Golf is in effect. Model Local Rule E-12.

Limiting When Stroke Made From Putting Green Must Be Replayed Under Exception 2 to Rule 11.1b — Local Rule as prescribed in the Clarifications to the 2019 Rules of Golf is in effect. Model Local Rule D-7.

Pace of Play — See separate memorandum to players for pace of play policy, when applicable.

Stopping and Resuming Play — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule J-1.

All practice areas are closed during an immediate suspension for a dangerous situation until the Committee has declared them open. Players who practice on closed practice areas will be asked to stop practicing; failure to stop practicing might result in disqualification.

An immediate suspension will be signaled by one prolonged airhorn note. All other types of suspension will be signaled by three consecutive airhorn notes. Resumption of play will be signaled by two short airhorn notes.

Practice — Prior to and after a round in stroke play, a player may practice on the designated practice areas. Rule 5.2b covering practice in stroke play is modified in this way: A player may not practice on the competition course before or between rounds. Penalty for breach of Local Rule, see Rule 5.2.

Prohibiting Use of Motorized Transportation — Local Rule as prescribed in Section 8 of the Committee Procedures is in effect. Model Local Rule G-6.

When Competition Is Final — The competition is final when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of a prize ceremony, when all scores have been approved by the Committee.
