CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT AND INFORMATION

POLICIES & PROCEDURES/TERMS OF COMPETITION

The Texas Golf Association Tournament Information & Guidelines, Policies & Procedures, including the Code of Conduct and Dress Code are in effect throughout the championship. Violations will be dealt with based on the severity of the misconduct. All competitors should be familiar with all Texas Golf Association Policies & Procedures, as well as the Terms of Competition. RULES OF GOLF

The Texas Four-Ball will be conducted using the 2019 Rules of Golf as approved by the United States Golf Association and R&A, its interpretations and clarifications, 2022 Texas Golf Association Local Rules and Terms of Competition ("Hard Card") and all local rules provided by the Texas Golf Association.

WITHDRAWAL/NO SHOW POLICY

If you find you cannot compete in the Championship, you must officially withdraw from the event by contacting Read Langhenry, Tournament Director at (214) 468-8942 ext. 304 or rlanghenry@txga.org. SUBSTITUTION DEADLINE

Please make sure to confirm that you are registered with the correct teammate by checking the field list provided later in this packet. The deadline for substituting a teammate will be 5:00 PM CT on August 15th. No substitutions will be allowed following this deadline for any reason.

FORMAT AND FIELD SIZE

Play will be contested over 54 holes of Four-Ball stroke play with three (3) divisions; Championship, Senior, and Super Senior. Each division will play from separate tees/yardages and separate champions will be recognized in each division. At the conclusion of 36 holes, the field will be cut to the low 40 teams (and ties), with a pro-rated representation from each division. The pro-rated allocation of the teams making the cut from each division will be reflective of the number of teams in each division, relative to the total field size. The determination of the total field size, number of teams in each division and pro-rated representation making the cut (before ties) will be announced in conjunction with the pairings being posted.

The field is limited to 80 teams, as outlined below:

Championship - 25 & over (48 teams)

Senior - 55 & over (20 teams)

Super Senior - 65 & over (12 teams)

OFFICIAL PRACTICE ROUND

Each player is allowed one (1) complimentary practice round on Thursday, August 18th only. Players must contact the host club golf shop on or after Friday, August 12th to schedule a practice round tee time. Call the Comanche Trace Golf Shop at (830) 895-8505 to schedule your practice round. Teams must identify themselves as participants in the Texas Golf Association Texas Four-Ball.

STARTING TIMES/PAIRINGS

Starting times/pairings for the first and second rounds will be made available no later than Tuesday, August 16th online at www.TXGA.org. Final round starting times/pairings will be available in the evening preceding play (approximately one hour after the completion of play) online at www.TXGA.org. Final round starting times/pairings will be re-drawn based on total score following the previous rounds of play.

CARTS/TRANSPORTATION

Players are highly encouraged to ride during the practice round and all tournament rounds of the 2022 Texas Four-Ball. There will be a maximum of two players per cart and two carts per group.

CADDIES

Caddies are permitted during the Championship. Players are responsible for supplying their own caddie. Caddies must abide by the host facility dress code. The TGA will be utilizing the 'One-Seat' Policy throughout the championship. The player can ride in or move a golf cart with another player's caddie in it, so long as the player whose caddie is in the cart is not riding in another cart at the same time. As a reminder, players are responsible for the actions of their caddie.

SPECTATORS

Spectators are permitted and welcome to attend the Championship at no charge. Spectators must observe host club policies while attending the Championship and practice appropriate golf etiquette. **Spectator carts will not be permitted;** those with documented ADA requirements may request use of a medical cart prior to the Texas Four-Ball (Availability may be limited). PARKING

ADMITTANCE/PARKING

Where teams should park upon arriving at the Club at Comanche Trace will be determined by which wave (AM or PM) they are playing in each day.

CLUBHOUSE ACCESS AND PRACTICE FACILITIES

GOLF SHOP ACCESS

The Golf Shop will be open to players, spectators, and caddies during the duration of the Texas Four-Ball.

CLUBHOUSE ACCESS

The clubhouse will be OPEN for all players and spectators. The Vista Room (Food & Beverage) and golf shop building will be open for access throughout the championship. The Tap House will also be open for purchase of Food & Beverage.

PRACTICE FACILITIES

Will be open to players one (1) hour before their tee time.

Practice range will be CLOSED following the round the afternoon tee times. The practice putting greens will remain open for the entire day, as well as the practice chipping area adjacent to the driving range. Please do NOT chip onto the practice putting greens.

FOOD & BEVERAGE

PLAYER LUNCH

Player lunch will be provided during the first and second rounds of the Texas Four-Ball. Lunch will be provided in the **Vista Room**, located up the stairs adjacent to the golf shop, directly through the main entrance to the clubhouse. A 'buffet-style' lunch will be available between 11:00 AM - 3:00 PM on Friday and Saturday. All other food and beverage will be available **for purchase** at the Tap House (located next to the driving range). More information will be provided to players during Player Check-In (at the 1st tee) on Thursday, August 18th.

BOTTLED WATER AND SNACKS

Proper hydration for players, staff, and volunteers is a key element of TGA safety procedures for championships. The TGA will provide bottled water at multiple locations on the golf course: #1 Tee, #5 Tee, #10 Tee, #15 Tee.

SPECTATOR FOOD & BEVERAGE

Spectators may purchase food and drink from the Tap House, or from the player buffet in the Vista Room.

ACCEPTABLE PAYMENT

Comanche Trace accepts all major credit cards and cash.

AWARDS CEREMONY, PLAYER OF THE YEAR POINTS, SCORE POSTING

AWARDS CEREMONY & PRIZES

The Texas Four-Ball champion money clips will be presented to the champion team (in each division) at the conclusion of play on Sunday, August 21st. Golf shop credit will be given to the top finishing teams in each division. More information will be available after the cut on Saturday evening.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR POINTS

Texas Player of the Year points, respectively, will be awarded to the top 5 teams in the Championship and Senior Division, and top 3 teams in the Super Senior Division.

SCORE POSTING TO WHS

Four-Ball scores will not be posted to each player's GHIN numbers. Players wishing to post their own scores can do so with the appropriate course rating/slope (provided on the yardage handout).

OUT OF POSITION A group is *out of position* when it (A) completes play on a hole (replaces the flagstick or removes the last ball from the hole) later than the time scheduled in the attached chart and (B) reaches a par 3 hole and the preceding group has left the next tee or fails to clear the tee of the par 4 hole before the preceding group has left the putting green, or arrives at the tee of a par 5 hole when the preceding group is on the putting green. Both (A) and (B) must occur for a group to be out of position.

TIMING When the Committee determines that a group (or individual) will be timed, all players (or a specified individual) in the group will be notified by a Referee. Players will have 40 seconds to play a stroke. The timing of a player's stroke will begin when it is his turn to play and he can play without interference or distraction. Any time spent determining yardages will count as time taken for the next stroke.

On the putting green, timing will begin after the player has been allowed reasonable time to mark, lift, clean and replace his ball, repair his ball mark and other ball marks on his line of putt, and remove loose impediments on his line of putt.

PENALTY FOR EXCEEDING 40 SECONDS

FIRST OFFENSE – Informed of “Bad Time”

SECOND OFFENSE – One Stroke Penalty

THIRD OFFENSE – Two Stroke Penalty

FOURTH OFFENSE - Disqualification

RULES / OTHER

INCIDENTS Should a ruling or other legitimate delay cause a group to lose its position, the group is obligated to regain its position within a reasonable time.

DISCONTINUANCE OF PLAY

A SUSPENSION FOR A DANGEROUS SITUATION WILL BE SIGNALLED BY ONE PROLONGED AIR HORN NOTE. All other types of suspension will be signaled by three consecutive air horn notes. Resumption of play will be signaled by two short air horn notes.

PRACTICE AREAS

All practice areas are closed during a suspension for a dangerous situation until the committee has declared them open.

EVACUATION PROCEDURE

If the course is to be evacuated for a DANGEROUS SITUATION, **groups must discontinue play immediately and evacuate the golf course. Players are asked to proceed directly to the Clubhouse (where lunch is located) for further information.**



Hydration Safety – Staying Cool Reminders

Temperatures for this year's championship are forecasted to be in the mid to high 90's Fahrenheit during the hottest parts of the day. The Texas Golf Association and the Club at Comanche Trace urge you to please take a moment and review the signs and symptoms of heat related illnesses, as well as some preventative measures below.

Coolers will be located on #1, #5, #10, & #15 tees. The on-course coolers are located next to the cart path or on the teeing areas.

Types of Heat Related Illness

Heat Cramps: Symptoms include painful cramping and spasms of legs, arms, and/or abdominal muscles.

Heat Exhaustion: Symptoms include feeling tired, weak and dizzy; headache, nausea and possible vomiting. Heavy perspiration; skin feels moist.

Heat Stroke: Symptoms include feeling tired, weak and dizzy. Skin feels hot and dry – even under armpits; appears red and flushed. May become delirious and unconscious.

These may be signs of life-threatening situations... Please contact the referee assigned to your group or dial 911 from your mobile device.

Avoid Dehydration... Perform Your Best When It's Hot

- Drink two 8-ounce glasses of water, juice, or sports drink up to two hours before physical activity.
- Drink 4 to 8 ounces or more of water or sports drink 5-10 minutes before physical activity.
- Drink 8 to 10 ounces of fluid, or as much as you can tolerate, every 15-20 minutes during intensive physical activity.
- Avoid drinks with caffeine as these may cause muscle cramping.
- Eat plenty of fruits and vegetables to maintain adequate amounts of sodium, calcium and potassium.
- Taking salt tablets is not recommended, most food provides enough sodium.
- Stand or rest in the shade whenever possible.
- Wear light-colored clothing that is loosely woven and absorbent; wear a hat to shade your head.

Local Rules and Terms of the Competition

FOR 2022 TGA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Rules of Golf as approved by the United States Golf Association and R&A Rules Limited govern play. The following Local Rules and Terms of the Competition are in effect at all TGA Championships and qualifying rounds. See applicable "Notice to Players" and Tournament Information for modifications or additions to these Local Rules and Terms of Competition. Complete text of the Rules and Local Rules may be found in the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf, effective January 1, 2019.

Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the General Penalty: Match Play – Loss of Hole; Stroke Play – Two Strokes

Out of Bounds – Defined by the line between the course-side points, at ground level, of white stakes and fence posts. A ball that crosses any road defined as out of bounds and comes to rest beyond that road is out of bounds, even though it may lie on another part of the course.

Penalty Areas – When a penalty area is defined only on one side, it extends to infinity. When a penalty area is connected to the out-of-bounds edge, the penalty area extends to and coincides with out of bounds.

Back-On-the-Line-Relief – Model Local Rule E-12 as prescribed in the Clarifications to the 2019 Rules of Golf is in effect. This applies in the application of Rules 16.1c(2), 17.1d(2), 19.2b, and 19.3b.

Abnormal Course Conditions (Including Immovable Obstructions) – See Rule 16.1.

- a. Ground Under Repair:
 - i. Areas completely encircled with white lines.
 - ii. French drains.
 - iii. Bunker liners. Interference does not exist if the liner interferes with only the player's stance.
 - iv. Seams of cut turf – Model Local Rule F-7 is in effect.
 - v. Damage made by animals (hog, skunk, and the like) – Model Local Rule F-10 is in effect.
- b. Immovable obstructions
 - i. White-lined areas tying into an obstruction are treated as part of the obstruction.
 - ii. When landscaped or garden areas (flower beds, shrubbery or the like) are completely encircled by an obstruction, the obstruction and the landscaped area are treated as one abnormal course condition.
 - iii. Stakes, ropes, wires, or other objects supporting trees or tree limbs, provided they are not closely attached. The tree or tree limb is not part of the obstruction.
 - iv. Where the outside edge (non-golf course side) of a road or path defines out of bounds, the road or path is an obstruction.

Immovable Obstructions Close to Putting Greens – Model Local Rule F-5 is in effect and is modified as follows: For a ball in the general area, relief is allowed only when both the ball and the immovable obstruction lie in an area cut to fairway height or less, the immovable obstruction may be on the putting green.

Wood Chips and Mulch – Are loose impediments.

Integral Objects –

- a. Cables, rods, wires, and wrappings that are closely attached to trees.
- b. Artificial walls and/or pilings when located within penalty areas.
- c. Where artificial retaining walls and/or pilings define the edge of bunkers, the artificial retaining walls or pilings are integral objects and are in the general area.

Permanent Elevated Power Lines – If it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit a permanent elevated power line or cable during the play of a hole, the stroke does not count. The player must play a ball without penalty from where the previous stroke was made in accordance with Rule 14.6.

Pace of Play – Rule 5.6b (3). The Texas Golf Association Pace of Play Policy is in effect.

Temporary Immovable Obstructions (TIOs) – Tents, signage, electronic scoreboards, circulation fans and any other temporary structures installed specifically for this championship are deemed to be Temporary Immovable Obstructions. Model Local Rule F-23.

Specifications of Clubs and the Ball.

- a. List of Conforming Driver Heads – Model Local Rule G-1 is in effect.
- b. List of Conforming Golf Balls – Model Local Rule G-3 is in effect.
- c. Replacing Club that is Broken or Significantly Damaged – Model Local Rule G-9 as prescribed in the Clarifications to the 2019 Rules of Golf is in effect.

Limiting When Stroke Made from Putting Green Must Be Replayed Under Exception 2 to Rule 11.1b – Model Local Rule D-7 as prescribed in the Clarifications to the 2019 Rules of Golf is in effect.

Methods for Stopping & Resuming Play – Model Local Rule J-1 is in effect.

- a. An immediate suspension of play will be signaled by one prolonged airhorn note.
 - b. All other types of suspension will be signaled by three consecutive airhorn notes.
 - c. Resumption of play will be signaled by two short airhorn notes.
- All practice areas are closed during an immediate suspension for a dangerous situation until the Committee has declared them open. Players who practice on closed practice areas will be asked to stop practicing; failure to stop practicing might result in disqualification.

Practice – Prior to and after a round in stroke play, a player may practice on the designated practice areas. Rule 5.2b covering practice in stroke play is modified in this way: A player may not practice on the competition course before or between rounds. Penalty for breach of Local Rule, see Rule 5.2.

Scorecard Returned – Scorecards must be attested and returned immediately after the completion of a round to the designated TGA scoring area. The player's score is considered final when the player has left the designated scoring area.

When Competition is Final – The competition is final when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in absence of a prize ceremony, when all scores have been approved by the Committee. The result of a match is final when the Committee has approved the result as posted on the public scoreboard or website.

TGA Code of Conduct:

Players (and their caddies) are to observe proper golf etiquette at all times. Any abuse or disrespect of fellow competitors, officials, spectators, employees of the host facility, or other persons conducting or attending a TGA sponsored event can be grounds for disqualification from the event, and possible rejection of entry for future TGA events. Such abuse may be verbal or physical or threat thereof and includes but is not limited to: use of obscene language, physical damage to property or equipment including that of the TGA or the host facility, and being under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances during a round.
